It is a great pleasure to present this Annual Report for the year 2020-21 as we have done a number of achievements that resulted in preventing COVID-19, improving the living conditions of tribal families, promoting the environment through tree plantation and distribution of smokeless chulas to the tribal families.

Our NGO was selected to participate in the capacity building programme under Niranthara Programme implemented by Dhwani Foundation, Bangalore. This programme built the confidence that we would be able to expand and scale up our work to benefit more people in the years to come.

We fulfilled all legal compliance including opening a bank account in SBI, New Delhi Main Branch as required by the Ministry of home affairs to receive foreign contributions under FCRA Act. We registered our NGO in the Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) portal to be eligible to receive CSR Funds. Through establishing a partnership with UnitedWay of Chennai (UWC), we helped our target villages to get safe drinking water, Pond rejuvenation programme to recharge and enhance the groundwater level.

We have initiated a number steps to strengthen our Governance, Improve the credibility and transparency through digitalizing our accounts and bringing energetic new people in the board. Some of the above are some key highlights and the report explains in detail about the impact our work created among the beneficiaries during 2020-21.



## INTRODUCTION ABOUT ORGANIZATION

ASSCOD is a non-profit, registered Association, Registered under Tamilnadu Societies Registration Act. The Registration number of the organization is 111/1994. The organization is registered under Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA) of 1976 and 2010. Our organization renewed its FCRA registration with Ministry of Home Affairs to receive foreign contribution and the renewal is valid till December 2021.

Our NGO has exemption status under sections 12A and 80G of Income Tax ACT. ASSCOD has consultative status with department of economic and social affairs, United Nations. ASSCOD is empaneled with TATA Institute of Social Sciences (TISS) CSR Hub and National Foundation for Corporate Social Responsibility (NFCSR), Ministry of Corporate Affairs. Our NGO is approved through registration of CSR Form-1to receive CSR Funds as per recent amendment in CSR Laws 2021.

#### VISION

ASSCOD's vision is of all people in rural India living in an economically developed society, having access to good education and being in good health.

#### **MISSION**

ASSCOD empowers rural women and their families through facilitating economic development, establishing educational opportunities and enabling health improvements.

ASSCOD targets groups among lower caste families who are living below the poverty line, these are mainly in the rural areas of Cheyyar and Vandavasi Blocks in Tamilnadu, India.

### **STRATEGY**

Our NGO has been implementing a number of development projects through Women Self Help Groups as they have been proved to be successful and efficient strategic tools to achieve desired and concrete results.

## **HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR 2020-21**

- ❖ Started 4 tuition centers to exclusively benefit 100 tribal children
- ❖ Provided dry ration kits to 250 tribal families those who were affected by lockdown due to COVID-19
- Planted 5000 saplings under tree plantation programme in 6 Panchayats
- Provided COVID-19 prevention services to the people through BL Shed Clinic
- Provided 10 disinfectant sprays to 10 Panchayats to clean the villages to prevent COVID-19
- Our NGO has been selected to participate in Niranthara Programme sponsored by Dhwani Foundation, Bangalore
- ❖ Established rapport with an NGO named India Welfare Trust (IWT) and provided micro finance to three women those who lost their livelihood during COVID-19 lockdown.
- ❖ Worked with United Way Chennai as networking partner and supported one of our target villages to get RO water plant, 91 tribal families to fruit trees and smokeless chulas.
- ❖ Built the NGO capacity through employee volunteering programme of Seclore, Mumbai and PayPal, Chennai.
- ❖ Recruited one new Compliance Finance Manager (CFM) to computerize the accounts and to fulfill all legal compliance on time.
- ❖ It is proposed to revisit our Vision, Mission and Values statements and to revise the same to align with the Objectives and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

## **PROJECTS**

#### WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

We started a project titled Capacitation of women for sustainable development in the year 2003 and completed the project in 2013. Though we completed the project, we still extend handholding support to the Women SHGs to ensure the sustainability.

Activities and Achievements on our women empowerment programme

During 2020-21

- ➤ Capacitated 300 women SHGs through facilitating our staff members to attend their meetings
- Facilitated 80% of the members to learn about Covid-19 and to be prepared for prevention.
- ➤ Planning to conduct a survey to assess the impacts created by our NGO and to facilitate the SHGs to function independently from 2021-22 onwards.

#### CASE STUDIES ON WOMEN EMPOWERMENT PROGRAMMES:

#### Micro finance for the poor women in SHGs to promote their livelihood

ASSCOD received Rs.1, 50,000 on 1<sup>st</sup> March 2021 from India welfare Trust to support the livelihood activities of 3 women in Kancheepuram District. We have disbursed Rs. 80,000 to the following 2 women

## Beneficiary 1 - Mrs. Indira w/o. Selvam, Periyakalathumedu, Perunagar:

She wants to run a petty shop in Perunagar where she ran the shop profitably before Corona lock down declared. But, during the lock down and post lock down, she was not able to open the shop and so she lost her investment. She has 2 daughters and both are studying (One in Govt arts college and another one in Govt.Hr.sec.school, Perunagar).



Although she preferred to restart her petty shop, she changed her plan of running petty shop and to rear a milch animal instead.

As her husband became sick and Mrs.Indirani herself a fire victim, she decided to rear the milk animal. So, we gave her Rs.40, 000 to purchase a milch animal. She is now getting 12 liters of milk every day and selling the same for Rs.360/day. This income helps her to meet out her family expenses.

## Beneficiary 2 - Mrs.Lakshmi w/o. Elumalai, Sethupattu

Mrs.Lakshmi is an agricultural labourer. Her husband is also a casual labourer. She has 2 daughters and one son. All of them got married and settled in Chennai. Both

Mrs.Lakshmi and her husband is living in a small house in Sethupattu. As their income is not permanent and couldn't get any concrete financial support from her son, they are running a tough life. So, it was decided to give her a milch animal based on her self-help group recommendation. She purchased a pregnant cow and it will give birth to a calf in next one or two months and after that she can get continuous income for next one year.

# V. Improve Maternal Health.

## 3. CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY (CSR) INITIATIVES

The Ministry of Corporate Affairs has notified Section 135 of the Companies Act 2013 as well as the provisions of the Companies (Corporate Social Responsibility Policy) Rules, 2014 to come into effect from April 1, 2014.

With effect from April 1, 2014, every company, private limited or public limited, which either has a net worth of Rs 500 crore or a turnover of Rs 1,000 crore or net profit of Rs 5 crore, needs to spend at least 2% of its average net profit for the immediately preceding three financial years on corporate social responsibility activities. The CSR activities should not be undertaken in the normal course of business and must be with respect to any of the activities mentioned in Schedule VII of the 2013 Act.

#### Our NGO's readiness towards implementation of CSR projects:

Our NGO deputed all its staff members including the Executive Director to attend a number of training programmes/ workshops / seminars on corporate social responsibility. Our NGO is empaneled with National Foundation for Corporate Social Responsibility (NFCSR) and our NGOs Hub Code is:**IA Hub Code:**A000288.

Our NGO is also empaneled with TATA Institute of Social Sciences (TISS) CSR Hub.

Our NGO is registered with the Registrar of Companies, Ministry of Corporate Affairs to implement CSR activities.

Our NGO implemented projects under CSR availing funds from Sunpharmaceuticals, Mumbai, Total Gas Solutions, Mumbai, Mind Sports PVT Ltd, Seclore, Pune, Amrutanjan, Chennai.

United Way Chennai implemented a project through its field partner NGO known as **Association for Sustainable Community Development (ASSCOD)** to benefit the families badly affected by lock down due to COVID-19 and has reached out to 163 Families in Chengalpattu and Kancheepuram Districts mainly to provide dry ration kits

Dry ration kits were distributed to 63 vulnerable Tribal families in 3 Irular colonies in Uthiramerur Taluk, Kancheepuram District. The tribal families have been one of the most backward community both in economic and social aspects. Because of the Boded Labour Act enforcement, they have lost their traditional employment in Brick Kilns, Rice mills, Quarries etc,.

- ➤ 163 families with 652 family members severely affected by lock down, would be taking 3 times food for next 10 days and will lead hunger free days during lock down which lead to Zero Income.

# DISINFECTANT SPRAYS DONATION TO VILLAGE PANCHAYATS TO KEEP THE VILLAGES CLEAN AND HYGIENE

As the Covid -19 spread started in the rural areas, the Block Development Officer approached the Total Gas Solutions company to donate disinfectant sprays and the company decided to donate 11 Disinfectant sprays (11 Panchayat Villages) through our NGO. We purchased and handed over 11 disinfectant sprays to the Block Development Officers (BDOs for Regular and Schemes) in a small formal handing over programme held on 14-10-2020 at Total India( Total Gas Solutions), Sithalamangalam Village, Soorai Post, Maduranthakam Taluk, Chengalpattu District. The event was attended by the BDOs, Mr.Nirmalnarayanan, Total Gas Plant In charge, Sithalamangalam, ASSCOD NGO staff and BDO office staff members. The sprays have been put in use immediately after handing over.

#### Governance

The Society is governed by a board of members representing a cross section of professionals in various fields in which development field is a major one.

#### Legal status

The Society is a registered society and exempted from receiving donations under section 80G of IT Act 1961. Also, the society is registered with Foreigners Division of Ministry of Home Affairs and authorized to receive foreign contributions. In February '04 the society has been given NGO in Special Consultative status with the Economic and social Council of United Nations.

ASSCOD adheres to the norms prescribed for good governance of voluntary organizations and is admitted to the membership of Credibility Alliance, New Delhi.


## **Project Management**


