Vision Improve the quality of life of communities through holistic and integrated social development, thereby enabling communities to become self-reliant and more developed.


Mission Provide sustainable opportunities to improve health, education, livelihoods and gender equity from the human development perspective.

Objectives

- To plan and implement all kinds of development programmes for welfare and development of rural and urban areas like drinking water, sanitation, infrastructure development etc. To collaborate and cooperate with Government and Non-Governmental Organisations to undertake Programme on common problem relating to any socio-economic development, particularly in rural areas.
- To undertake programme aiming at raising peoples' critical awareness on environmental issues which primarily refer to the life sustaining resources and channelize their awareness into action programme that help in protecting the environment/ecology.
- To establish, maintain assist, improve and otherwise support both directly and indirectly medical institutions and programmes including but not restricted to hospitals, diagnostic centre, dispensaries and other health Institutions, both mobile and fixed in urban/ rural areas.
- To carry on, run, start, establish, and maintain all kinds of schools, technical centers, research and development centers and Institutions in urban / rural areas.
- To take up such activities of general public utility not involving the carrying on any activity for profit.
- To set up blood banks and eye banks on the basis of Voluntary donations.
- To do all necessary things for and incidental or conducive for the attainment of above objectives of the Trust including but not restricted to hiring personnel and consultants, entering into alliances and agreements of cooperation, soliciting and bidding for funds from Government and companies.



We are happy to share our Annual Report which include many insights from the grass roots. During this period Bhavishya Bharat has created tangible impact through community engagement as mandated by the CSR of

Teesta Urja HEP III. Our key partners Teesta Urja Limited, The Hans Foundation and SBI Foundation have continuously provided us support. Furthermore, our comprehensive planning and focus to implement the interventions has significantly transformed the lives of the communities in the project villages of North, South and West Sikkim.

Bhavishya Bharat continuous efforts in the execution of the integrated community development activities have paid handsome dividends, especially interventions such as community access to primary health care, providing quality education to children, building capacities to enhance livelihood opportunities for women and other social development programmes which include creating infrastructure and social assets.

Keeping in view of Sikkim's local farming paradigms and recent recognition as India's first fully organic state, we have promoted and motivated the community to cultivate large cardamom by establishing nurseries to cover all project villages. In addition, the community was trained to prepare and use of organic manure and vermicompost, make eco-friendly dustbins through traditional weaving method and enhance mushroom production by promoting new technique of replacing paddy straw with locally available sawdust and maize husk. Innovative farming practices encouraged group farming to optimize yields and resources as well.

Bhavishya Bharat has the privilege of reaching out to approximate 3,50,000 deprived people for improving their quality of life. Our Mobile Medical Units of THF - Sanjeevani, SBI - Sanjeevani and Teesta Urja Ltd have altogether provided primary health care services to around 10,000 people in the project villages.

Our heartfelt thanks to Teesta Urja Limited, The Hans Foundation, SBI Foundation and the Government of Sikkim for their continuous support and cooperation. It has enabled us to implement our interventions related to integrated community development throughout the year. 

Purpose of the Project



Sustainable Livelihood



Large Cardamom Nursery

The farmers in the project area have cultivated large cardamom being the main cash crop of the area. During the reporting period the team has visited the nurseries in Singhik, Pegong, Saffo, Theng & Tsungthang; imparted training, monitored the maintenance and discussed with cultivators for necessary support.

Candle Making Training

- Training programmes on candle making were conducted at different locations in the PVs. There were altogether 37 members participated to learn process of candle making.

Training on Organic Oyster Mushroom Cultivation

- Organic Oyster Mushroom Cultivation training along with distribution of seeds & paddy straw has been conducted in the PVs with 56 members at different locations.



Training Programme on Bag Making

- Training programmes on Wire Bag making were conducted at different locations in the PVs. There were altogether 143 members participated to learn different techniques of wire wrapping.

Vocational Sewing School (Affiliated with USHA International Ltd, Kolkata)

- Total 60 number of Trainees have been trained in dress designing.

Cattle Treatment Camp cum Awareness Programme on Animal Husbandry

Cattle treatment camps were conducted at Theng, Shipgyer & Singhik. There were altogether 54 cattle got treatment during the camp.

Member's thrift, credit, regular meeting and maintaining the required registers are some of the important activities for group development. During the reporting period, the team visited all the women self-help groups, conducted required training and discussed with members regarding their group activities.

Two mobile medical units launched for rural West Sikkim

GEYZING, January 24: Minister N.K. Subba flagged off two mobile medical vans, an initiative of Bhavishya Bharat, an NGO, today in a function held at Dentam. The mobile medical units will cater free medical services to the people belonging from rural belts of west Sikkim.

The mobile medical vans having all necessary medical facilities will reach out to the needy people with facilities such as mobile out-patient consultation, pathological tests and provision for medicines free of cost.

It is expected that the initiative started by the NGO will help in improving the health sector of the State. At

the initial part, the NGO has decided to run health camps at 40 villages of Dentam constituency, twice a month.

Bhavishya Bharat, a well-known NGO, has recently opened its branch at Dentam. The NGO, which is actively working for upliftment of social sector in different States of India, had started its Sikkim mission from north Sikkim. The NGO is working in the southern, central and north eastern region of India in the fields of five thematic areas - basic healthcare, education, social infrastructure development (common property resource), sustainable livelihood and disaster risk reduction.

Prashant Chettri, Bhavishya Bharat's State

programme manager informed that the objective of the organization is to make the services related to social sector of the country available in an easy way to the people. He added that the NGO is not-for-profit organisation having expertise in implementing integrated social development programmes and it aims at promoting integrated and inclusive development through social, economic and environmental interventions. "Our organization would be executing different public welfare schemes in west Sikkim for betterment of social sector," he said.
