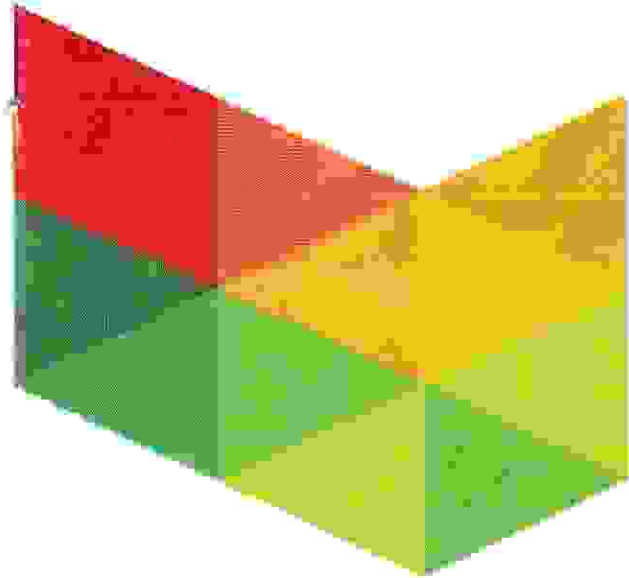


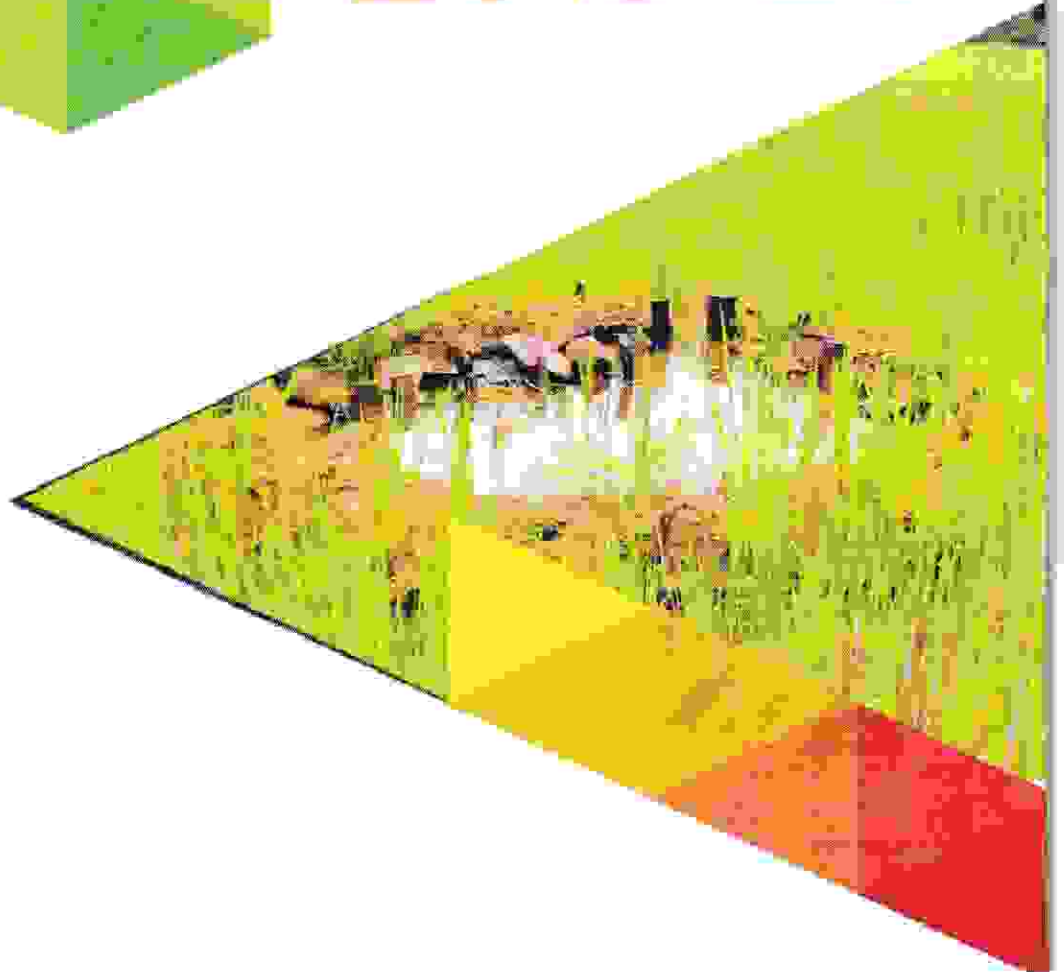

ABOUT ORGANIZATION

DEVELOPMENT & RELIEF DEPARTMENT

Development & Relief Department is one of the Sub-Department of Rongmei Naga Baptist Association (RNBA) Registered as non-profit, non-political society in the year 1985 and currently working in north east region of India Development is headed by a secretary and functioning with separate board member and identifying among the poor and marginalized. The present donors are Bread for the Word, Germany, HADP/NEC, SFURTI, NABARD - Manipur, CBTC/NEC and SELCO Foundation. At present, RNBA could make its presence in more than 95 villages benefitting some 12,625 families with crucial development and relief interventions.

Improved quality and dignity of human life through enhanced access to entitlements, land rights, livelihoods opportunities and sustainable agro-ecological practices, with focus on youth and women in Manipur, India.

Objective:

- ☞ To enhance access to Rights and entitlements from the Government
- ☞ To enhance land rights with focus on women land rights
- ☞ To enhance Livelihood situation through green base income
- ☞ To promote sustainable NRM through Agro-ecological approaches

The activities taken up under Bread for the World (Brot), Germany are Enhancing access to Entitlements, Enhancing land right with focus on women land rights, Livelihoods Improvement (green income), Sustainable NRM through Agro-ecological Approaches through complete community involvement in the form of formal village level institutions and working towards democratized local governance.

Project is being implemented by 6 partner NGOs in 29 villages in five hill and one valley districts covering about 22,150 people belonging to different ethnicity and religion. The average family size is about 6 as per baseline surveyed. There are Christians, Muslims and Hindus, belonging to about 10 major ethnic groups, with dominance of Rongmei and Meitei. Kukis followed by Zeme. Project area population is predominantly poor, as evidenced in the livelihood profile of the baseline surveyed.



Over the last decade, the dependency in jhum (shifting cultivation) which has been the local tradition, culture and main food production system, seems to have reduced as per the land use changes sample information collected from project villages (2 villages as sample from each of 6 NGOs).

This change in land use has also impacted the local land tenure system. There has been increase in individual land and landless population at the cost of decrease in community right

Improved quality and dignity of human life through enhanced access to entitlements, land rights, livelihood opportunities and sustainable agro-ecological practices, with focus on youth and women in Manipur, India.

BroT project has been working in 5 villages under Jamenglong District, for women, men, youth and for the community as a whole. EED project has been working and trying to enhance a sustainable livelihood for the people through various activities such as practicing of horticulture in a larger patch of land where women SHGs come together share their work, burden which can help one another. Cultivation of traditional crops has been regenerated and regeneration of forest products has also been carried out in all the villages. Revival of old good practices has been promoted. Market linkage has been carried out for the products produce by the community. During this year's EED/BRoT has formed a total of 5 VDCs and 16 women SHGs in project villages.



Why EED/ BRoT project:

- Poor and marginalized people
- Works with 229 families in five project villages
- Traditional practice
- Capacity building – helping hand in hand with village level institutions/ farmers group, capacitated for conservation of natural resource management
- Promotion of women land rights
- Promotion of sustainable livelihood
- Convergence with government programmes and schemes
- Best alternate to jhum cultivation

Activities:

Enhance access to rights and entitlements:

- 557 youth and community people participated the sports day at project villages.
- Awareness raising on rights, rights holders has conducted at project villages participated the training programme on rights and entitlements.

To enhance land rights with focus to women land rights:

- 11 terrace fields, 5 homesteads and 3 horticulture fields of individuals in the village have mapped.
- Focused women SHGs have been cultivating varieties of food in the community patch of land.
- Stakeholder's consultation meeting has conducted with regard to women land rights with various stakeholders of the district and with women leaders.

Livelihood improvement through green income:

- Handicrafts training has been provided to all the interest Youth from the project villages to enhance their livelihood
- Some trained youth are really doing well in handicrafts producing good quantity of fruit baskets, almirah, dining table, flowers, hair clips etc
- 21 women attended the mushroom training and some women are practicing at home

Sustainable NRM through agro-ecological approaches:

- 38 women have promoted to cultivation of traditional crops in the project villages
- 43 women have promoted to homestead in the five villages
- 55 women have promoted to horticulture cultivation in the project villages
- 1000 saplings of myrrh and parkia (tree beans) has distributed and planted in the village reserve forest are for the community

Outcome:

- Average and net income increased as measured baseline income.
- Trainees are earning an income of 1000 to 2000 per month

NABARD Programmes:

RNBA in collaboration with NABARD has been working for more than 2 decades now on rural taking forward activities. The commitment is to uplift the marginalized community. Improved and sustainable livelihood is the major focus for better and enhanced existence of the community.

RNBA with the support from NABARD had completed decent number of projects for the poor and needy. Some of the completed projects include MEDP, FLAC, formation of WSHG, FPO, etc.

Ongoing projects supported:

Springshed Based Watershed Development Program is implemented at Tandaijang village, Noney District, Manipur. The project aims at restoring the springs to its normalcy so that water sources are perennial and used for different agriculture purposes. Main activities include digging of staggered contour trenches to prevent soil erosion and conserve water, contour farming, construction of gabion structure to prevent mudslide, construction of spring collection chamber to collect and store spring water, etc. The project is in its mid implementation phase and is expected to bring positive impact.



New phase is under implementing at Lubanglong village, Khoupum, Noney District, Manipur. The project in this village is in its Pre-Project Implementation Phase and is anticipated to move forward with the Project Implementation Phase in immediate future.

Implementation of HADP under Deputy Commissioner Noney District, Manipur

The project is aiming at enhancing livelihood with existing products like bamboo shoot, tea leaves, king chilly, banana, turmeric and ginger of Noney district. The project will fill the gaps of productions and marketing with technology and infrastructure intervention which is the core issue for hampering the productions and marketing.

The structure of the project consists of SHGs & farmers club at the village level with village level project monitoring committee. There will be informal common interest cooperatives and SHG federation at Sub-division level. The local level institutions will be responsible for production and primary processing.

Activities

- ✓ Community mobilization and formation, strengthening of Self Help Group, Farmers Club and FPC.
- ✓ Developed Four Model Villages.
- ✓ Installation of Processing Units.
- ✓ Developing Incubation centre for skill development.



Components of Model Village

1. **Sloping Agriculture Land Technology (SALT)**, otherwise known as contour hedgerow intercropping (agroforestry) technology (CHIAT), is a system in which dense hedgerows of fast growing perennial nitrogen-fixing tree or shrub species are planted along contour lines thus creating a living barrier that traps sediments and gradually transforms the sloping land to terraced land.
2. **Sustainable livestock** production through community livestock breeding with primary processing for local organic feed through the production of feed crops by farmers' club and SHGs and also linkages with veterinary department. The activity is part of practices to diversify farm component and connect among different farm components by integrating livestock.
3. **Forest Regeneration**-There are more than hundreds species which has multiple benefits like medicinal, aromatic, fruits and vegetables, resins, tubers, and several other purposes. Most often community collect from forest non-timbers forest produces but regeneration is lacking seriously.
4. **Community Nursery bed** aims of building community Nursery to grow plants for transplanting, for use as stock for budding and grafting, and for sale to generate income. The nursery allows for a better medium of growth for the plants than when directly seeded on the field.

5. **Water augmentation** aims to achieve safe and sustainable water services both in terms of services to the community and conservation of precious water resources. The project will provide continuous water services to entire population of the village. Besides achieving equal distribution and coverage efficiency, it will also reduce the time in accessing alternative sources of water.

CANE & BAMBOO BASED FURNITURE AND UTILITY PRODUCT CLUSTER PROJECT IN TAMENGLONG, MANIPUR

On 2019, Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of Traditional Industries (SFURTI) is initiated Ministry of MSME, Government of India to promote Cluster Development in the year 2005. It is a scheme for enhancing Productivity, Competitiveness, Product Development, design intervention and Packaging.



Main objectives

- To organized the traditional artisans into clusters to make them competitive and provide for their long term sustainability.
- To promote rural entrepreneurs and sustained employment traditional industry
- To enhance marketability of Products by providing training supports for new products
- To equip traditional artisans to improve skills through training and exposure visits
- To make provision for common facilities and improve tools and equipment for artisans
- To Strengthen the cluster governance system with active participation of the stakeholders
- To build Innovative and traditional skills, improved technologies, advanced processes, market intelligence and new models of public-private partnerships

Activities of SFURTI

The project activities cover three types of interventions namely Soft Interventions, Hard Interventions and Thematic Interventions.

Soft Interventions

- General awareness in 15 villages of Tamenglong and Noney District
- Skill Development and Capacity building through training
- Market promotions initiatives through fairs and exhibition
- Design and Product Development & Provide Artisan Identity Card

Hard Interventions

- Construction of 1 Common Facilities Centre and 3 spoke units
- Training Centre & Value addition and Processing Centre
- Tool and technology up-gradation

Thematic Interventions

- Emphasis on both domestic and international markets
- Promotion initiative through media & E-commerce initiatives

PROMOTION OF CANE AND BAMBOO HANDICRAFT UNDER CBTC, ASSAM

Cane and Bamboo Technology Centre in collaboration with RNBA has facilitated the emergence of a new scenario in the two district Manipur namely Noney and Tamenglong. Three (3) years of working with CBTC has struck the imaginations of the people and led them on to dream about the possibility of a healthy future. CBTC also involves its creativity and resource in talent scouting, training, technology sourcing and market linkage for giving a new age thrust to the age old bamboo sector.

Objectives

- To promote scientific development in the cane and bamboo sector
- To provide skill and awareness to entrepreneurs, artisans, technicians and trainers etc.
- To promote employment and income generation activities in the cane and bamboo sector.
- To set up documentation centre and a data bank for referral.
- To provide consultancy services in the field of cane and bamboo.
- To encourage and participate in any other developmental activity.
- To create a Centre of Excellence in promoting the Cane & Bamboo Industry in the North Eastern Region.

Residential training on promoted Cane & Bamboo Products

- 15 days residential training on cane & bamboo furniture at Noney April, 1st to 15th 2019
- 10 days training Cane and Bamboo Furniture at Noney From June, 10th to 20th 2019
- 20 days residential training on cane & bamboo furniture at Noney 17th Feb to 7th March 2020



ECONOMICALLY AND ENVIRONMENTALLY SUSTAINABLE SOLUTION FOR LIVELIHOOD, EDUCATION AND HOME LIGHTING

SELCO Foundation Bangalore in partnership with Rural Manganal Imphal under the project title "economically and environmentally sustainable solution for livelihood, education and home lighting" in Noney and Tamenglong districts of Manipur. RNBA could able to provide solar for home lighting and solar for deep freezer for young entrepreneurs, family lighting, community meeting and students studies.

Case study

Mr. Gangkhon Kamei 45 years old an unemployed father living with is old mother, wife and five children. He is from Okoklong village situated in interior part, 15 km away from Nungba Sub-Division HQ. His family main income is from daily wages and selling of seasonal vegetables. There is irregular electricity connection under government scheme for the village since 2004.

Frequently community meeting was held in his residence as his house is located in middle of the village heart. During rainy season ranging from May to July every year, electricity is very irregular and uncertainty as the line cut due to falling of trees and heavy rain. He used kerosene and candle as main optional mean for lighting every night time.

The difficulties part is having food, studies and meeting under a dimmed light of kerosene lamp and candle. No feeling of comfort in resting under dark and dimmed light after a long day works. Apart from paying electricity bill, extra expenses gone on buying kerosene and candle.

On August 2019, a great helped from SELCO by installed solar home lighting, his family is happy to see bright light every night, no tension for having food and children studies. Conducting community meeting is no more a headache for the family and also villagers.

"I have experiencing the benefit of solar home lighting system on four things" Mr. Gangkhon narrated.

- Pleasingly using light in night time without spent extra money from our minimum earning.
- No short circuit & burning of house can happen in solar as electric current do.
- Less tension for long 3 months rainy season and also for the whole year.

He said "Knowing someone there for us, I and my family owed to them greatly, great relief come in my life, for I will narrate the importance of light in our life to my neighbours and friends.

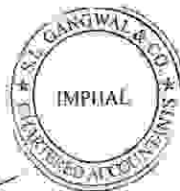
