- Is free from exploitation and abuse

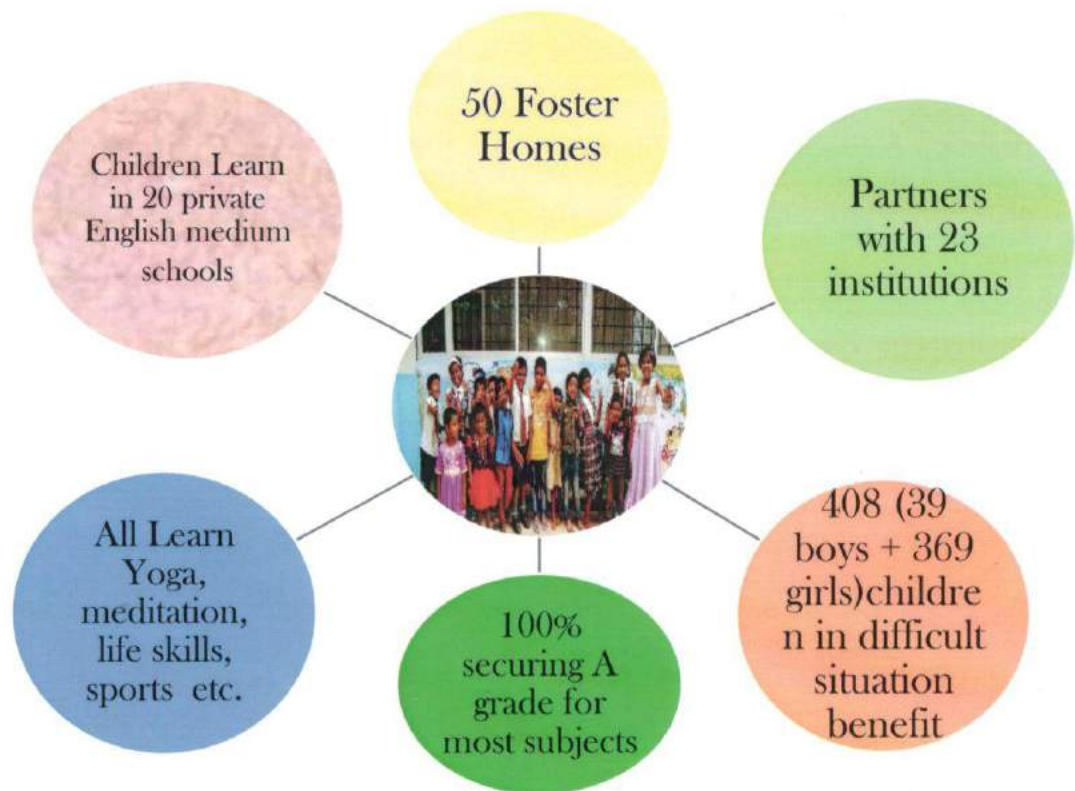


Our Dreams

- To house and educate the most disadvantaged and socially excluded children in a professional and dignified manner in collaboration with different stakeholders.
- Rehabilitation and quality care to the destitute and elderly upholding their dignity as individuals.
- Support skilling of underprivileged and socially excluded especially the youth.
- Building Networks and Alliances to advocate and liaison with government and other international agencies for the benefit of the poor, needy and voiceless.

Dream India Foster Home Program

A Glance 2018-2019



Foster Homes- A Home Away Home is a flagship programme conceived and executed by Dream India Network since 2011 with a vision to provide a caring and nurturing family to children who are at risk or in difficult situations so that they flower to their full potentials. Each foster home is an alternative family for 8 children with a mother who looks after the children as her own children. Altogether there are 52 homes across the different zones of Bangalore city catering to the whole development of 425 children. Children in each home is cared and nurtured just as in a normal family where he/she is provided with the best English Medium education. Children also receive wide opportunities to blossom to their potentialities. They receive life skill education, health care, counseling, recreation opportunities (sports and play) and literary, art & cultural opportunities.

KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- a) **Inauguration of new homes:** in this year of Review 7 new foster homes are established in different parts of Bangalore and nearby Districts. They are:
- Adrian Children's home for 16 girls at Geddalhalli by Sisters of St. Charles Boromeo- 20th July 2018
 - Christie Novathma Children's home for 8 boys at Lingarajapuram on 21th July 2018
 - Arunodaya Children's home for 8 girls at Bull temple road Bengaluru by Sisters of Daughters of the Church - 24th July 2018
 - Elizebath Children's home for 8 girls at Madiwala by Franciscan sisters of St.Elizebath- 12-08-2018
 - Ashaniketan Children's home for 16 girls at Kothanur by Sisters of Mercy of the Holy Cross- 15th Aug. 2018
 - Ashraya Children's home for 8 girls at Savanur by Sisters of the Daughters of the Church- 20th Sep. 2018
 - SanjoeBhavan home for 8 girls at J.P.Nagar by sisters of the Destitute- 30th Sep. 2018

Strength: - 72 more children totaling to 422 children from marginalized and vulnerable families are rehabilitated

Education: All these children (72) are placed in the new homes and are admitted in prestigious English medium schools for their academics.

Life skills: All children receive weekly sessions on various life skills that will contribute in moulding them as sensitive, responsible and responsive citizens of the society.

Sports for Development: Children are provided with the opportunity for sports and games which supports and inculcates the values of co-operation, team spirit, adjustment, controlling ones emotions, social interaction etc.

Summer Camp: Senior children from all foster homes engage themselves in a summer camp organized to develop and promote their potentialities in different areas- sports, culture, literary, art etc.

Medical and Dental camp: One medical and Dental checkup was organized covering all children in the 50 homes. By and large all children enjoyed good health and no major health issues are reported

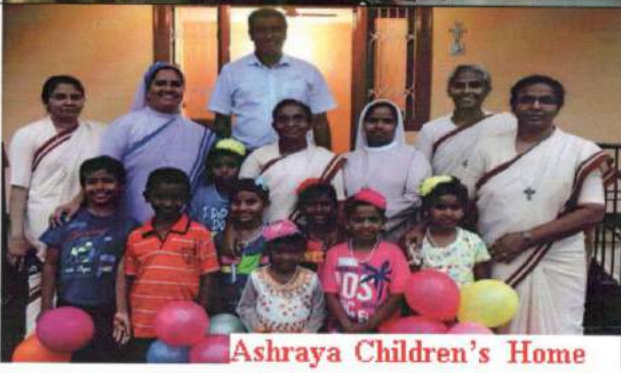

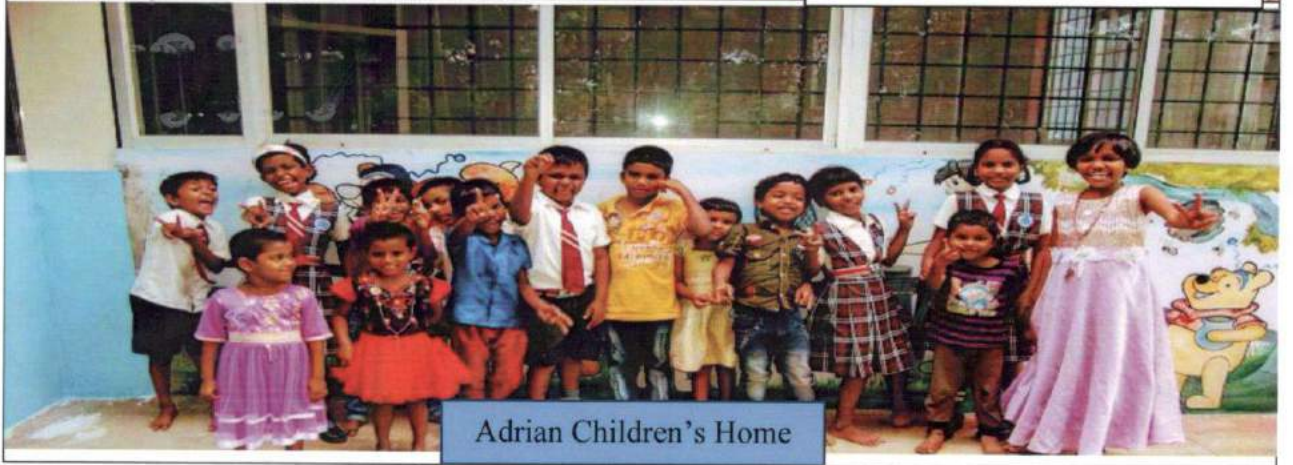
