Society for Rural and Urban Joint Activities Nagpur was registered as society in 1998. The organization is working in the rural and tribal belt of Yavatmal and Gadchiroli district since then. The organization takes up study and action research projects. It strives to evolve self reliant and sustainable societal patterns with the help of locally available resources.

SRUJAN continues its emphasis of its activities towards strengthening the cause of PTGs with whom it works. The office established in Bhamragad for this purpose and a sub-office has been established in Lahari to facilitate the work in the Abuj Mad area of Maharashtra. Work on Food and Nutrition Security and Saving Newborn initiative amongst Kolam in 25 villages and more than 15 hamlets continue in Yavatmal district. In the current year SRUJAN in collaboration with UNICEF has continued work on "Child Protection and Promotion of Education Rights of Children in Kolam dominated Zari Jamni Block of Yavatmal district. SRUJAN advocate's the PTG issues at the national level and work towards evolving a policy for primitive tribes in India along with likeminded people and institutions. Following planned activities were conducted during the year 2014-2015 for this purpose.

1 Livelihood security

SRUJAN with the help of Oxfam India continued Strengthening Particularly Vulnerable Tribal groups in Vidarbh, Madias in Gadchiroli and Kolams in Yavatmal district, to educate and inform tribal communities about Provisions of Acts like Tribal Self Rule Act, Biological Diversity Act, Forest Rights Act, MREGA. Community organizations like Biodiversity Management Committee (BMC) and Forest Rights Committee (FRC) were formed. Members of this committee later on prepared Peoples Biodiversity Registers (PBR) for their villages and prepared a plan for biodiversity restoration. This being implemented in 10 villages in Zhari Jamni block, 40 villages in Gadchiroli district.

This program is being implemented in Chattisgarh in 6 gram panchayats. Here the community members are being assisted in documentation for raising individual forest rights claims, community forest right claim under the provision of Forest Rights Act, 2006.

2 Bamboo Based Livelihoods

SRUJAN continued the program on developing bamboo based livelihood in Gadchiroli district of Maharashtra. This program has been supported by Sir Dorabji Tata Trust, Mumbai.

The program envisages developing high quality bamboo sapling appropriate for use as building material, for handicraft, for food, for housing, for furniture and for handicraft. It envisages developing small scale enterprise that shall develop products that could be marketed.

3. Diversion based irrigation system

SRUJAN is carrying out the program 'Diversion Based Irrigation' with association of DILASA (Jamshedji Tata Trust) in Zhari block and Bhamragad block. 12 farm ponds and 3 diversion based irrigation sites have been developed so far enhancing the irrigation capacities of farmers and making water available for entire year for back yard kitchen gardens.

4. Kanha Pench Landscape symposium

SRUJAN collaborated with De fries Bajpai foundation, USA for hosting International symposium on Kanha Pench Landscape for corridor management for tiger conservation in Central India. 32 researchers from India and abroad, key functionaries from Forest Department of India participated in the symposium. Need for evolving corridor management strategies for tiger conservation were discussed by the participants.

5. Promoting Mental Health Services

SRUJAN's staff capacitated through trainings and exposure visit held by Basic Needs India from time to time arranged for 7 mental health camps at Mulgavan in Anandwan campus in collaboration with Maharogi Sewa Samiti. Dr Dinesh Narukar an psychiatrist from Mumbai is making regular visit once in two months and examines patients and recommends prescription. Dr. Narukar also brings with him medicines that are provided to patients free of charge.

This program is being carried out for PWMI from Zhari Jamni, Kelapur and Maregaon block people.

6. Women Empowerment

SRUJAN is actively involved in a number of programs and processes for working towards a safe environment for girls and women, towards building a violence free society. SRUJAN is member of various networks in Maharashtra and India working on women empowerment issues.

7. Child Protection and Child Education Initiative

Outcome of this workshop was a draft Policy on the additions and modifications required as per the needs of the tribal women from Vidarbha.
