Subhiksha Special School is a day care center catering to differently abled children and providing rehabilitation and intervention services for Mental Retardation, Cerebral Palsy, Autism, Multiple disabilities, Downs Syndrome and slow learners.

Subhiksha is working on various aspects in the field of disability such as Community based rehabilitation, therapeutic interventions and academic intervention comprising of Open schooling (NIOS). We work with specialChildren in a multi-dimensional approach for people with disabilities. We aim to help enhance the quality of the lives of our Special Children.

#### **Special Education:**

The Special education services of Subhiksha encompass a range of learning opportunities for children with disabilities, primarily with cerebralpalasy, intellectual disabilities, downsyndrome that plays a vital role in the planning of their future life. The special educator maps out the appropriate strategy for each child aiming at the current and future progress by involving the parents in all stages of the teaching-learning process. Group teaching and individual need-based teaching cover the overall area of learning. The team of teachers made efforts to deal with children with disabilities and their one-to-one session including guiding, counseling, sharing issues and motivating. The special educators prepared small tasks aiming long term goals of each child and trained their parents to accomplish it. In this academic year, a total of 85 students with different types of disabilities were provided special education services to mainstream them in learning and development process. A total of 23 new admissions took place in this academic year.

#### **Community Based Rehabilitation**

Community Based Rehabilitation include the intereventions which is applied in 5 Slum Communities of Telangana. Subhiksha endeavours to promote human inclusion by providing rehabilitation care, support the practice of education, strengthen economically the needy and advocate for social rights of children/persons with disabilities and families with socio-economic disadvantage. With the aim to carry out these benefits for target groups, projects have been implemented on the key components (Health, Education, Livelihood, Empowerment) of the Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) matrix from the World Health Organization (WHO). In order to provide rehabilitation services at door steps in the community, a resource centre has been developed for extremely poor children with disabilities. Our CBR team of around 15 people of diverse background has worked in the areas in collaboration with volunteers, local supporters and therapeutic staff members for social transformation of mainstreaming disabled and marginalized children through education and therapies.

#### **Services at Centre**

The rehabilitation services of Subhiksha aim to optimize the functional skills of children and youth with disabilities, making it less challenging for them to cope with the various demands of their environment. Subhiksha delivers rehabilitation services to children and persons with disabilities via a team of multidisciplinary professionals. Subhiksha treats children with movement disorders, speech and communication impairments, cognitive impairments and impaired social interaction, as well as a broad range of other developmental disorders. High quality services are delivered including physical therapy, special education, speech/language therapy, psychological and medical evaluations/interventions. The rehabilitation programme includes the screening and identification of children with disabilities, comprehensive assessments of complex individual needs, and the development of individual rehabilitation plans (IRP), all carried out by a multidisciplinary team with the aim of maximising the potential of each child. Most of the families availing services belong to poor social and economic backgrounds.

A total of 85 children received services in the period between April 2022 and March 2023. A transdisciplinary approach is followed, keeping family and child at centre. Every new registered child has gone through a comprehensive assessment by multidisciplinary professionals according to the need of the child. Children with different developmental disabilities were followed up. During the follow-up sessions, the team demonstrated the therapeutic activities to the child and his/her parents according to the IEP.

The team of audiologist and speech/language therapist, special educator, physiotherapist, occupational therapist, psychologist and neurologist interacted to address the issues of parents and children with cognitive impairment and other neuro developmental disabilities. It motivates parents to become more involved in their child rehabilitation programme. Home-based activities were designed for each child on the basis of his/her individual needs.

The programme provides an opportunity to the parents of children with disabilities to observe the therapy sessions provided by different therapists and also practice the same in front of them. The aim of this programme is to train parents so they can participate in the rehabilitation process of their child. It helps the child to become independent to some extent. The duration of intensive therapy session is 45 minutes daily by each therapist (speech therapy, physio therapy and special education) for one week and repeated after 1-2 months, depending on individual needs. During this reporting tenures 65 children with disabilities received regular intensive therapy.

- A. Physiotherapy can go a long way in helping children with their movements and help develop weak muscles. Based on the individual rehabilitation plan physiotherapists plan the schedule for every child. The therapists work closely with each child and also assess the need for aids such as standers, walkers, wheelchairs or any other orthotic devices. The various interventions aim to
  - Strengthen and recuperate weak muscles
  - Ensure mobility with programs such as using walkers and wheelchairs
  - Help the child and family to become familiar with the equipment
  - Facilitate to achieve the desired goals through manual therapy, frame standing, standing bars, parallel bar training, balance training,
  - muscle stimulator etc
  - Advice supplementary home activities to family members and caregivers after training them.
- B. Occupational Therapy with multi-sensory integration: Occupational therapy promotes the health and well being of individuals Developing skills that are a must for daily living is the main objective of this intervention. Designed to improve basic motor functions and reasoning skills, thus the programme helps prevent permanent loss of functions. The intervention uses methods such as multi-sensory stimulation and integration to:
  - Help eat properly through oral-motor exercise
  - Improve motor skills by picking and releasing small objects
  - Teach new activities through imitation techniques
  - Tone up body balance through exercise like climbing stairs, jumping etc
- C. Hearing and Speech Therapy: The most important goal of speech therapy is to provide state-of =the art therapy facilities free of cost to the disadvantaged population to whom these services are either not available or too expensive. The main area of focus is to improve the child's existing disability through individualized therapy sessions thereby making them as independent as possible which is an important step towards social inclusion and acceptance.

Everyone likes to express. However it doesn't come very easy to our special children, This intervention helps in improving speech of the children and their ability to understand and express.

#### Our therapist work to:

- Test hearing ability of children
- Identify difficulties in articulation, fluency, resonance, or language disorders

Demonstrate the right sounding words and practice with children to follow the same

- Ensure proper mouth coordination to produce sounds to form words and sentences
- Help with voice volume regulation
- Address language disorders to help children express their thoughts
- Practice with Speech Trainer to develop children's speech
- D. Psychiatry and Counseling: Counseling is an extremely crucial part of the rehabilitation process. Children and parents are both counselled This intervention helps address the fears and needs for both. Since the parents and the children struggle with challenges in everyday life, acquiring new skills also leads to improvement in quality of life of the children as well as the parents
- E. Performing and Expressive Arts: Dancing and singing has been an integral part of human society. It is a great way to bond and has good health benefits. This dancing and singing not only helps improve muscle tone, spatial awareness and kinesthetic sensations but also facilitates with social skills.
- F. Sports: The sports programme enables children to learn things like following instructions, waiting for their turn, develop alternative solutions. This has further enhanced the confidence level of the children.

Under events all the occasions like Independence Day, Republic Day and festivals like Holi, Diwali and Dasara were celebrated.



#### **Founders' Voice**

The past few months in the post Covid situation there was a transition of classes from online to offline mode. Finally when the physical classes resumed fully this year, we assessed that most of the children has fallen back in their learning levels. We restarted with them and there was fresh assessment for every child even though most of them have been with us for few years. In some ways, it has been almost like restarting our centre. But if we look at the brighter side, it has been a kind of blessing in disguise. When a child has been with us for so many years he/she has been in a particular schedule and intervention. Now we are looking at every child afresh and re-drawing the development plan. We have also been able to bring in new interventions.

Efforts were also pointed towards the skill training of the adolescent girls and youth in the vocational courses the process of new admissions in the online portal of Vocational Board has been done.

#### **Summary of Activities organised in 2021-2022**

We run a day care center at Mahendra Hills, Secunderabad providing a range of services. We work with special Children in a multi-sectoral, multi-dimensional approach for people with disabilities with joint effort with participation of the family members and Subhiksha. Our services are the backbone of our work Through our programme of Life Skill Development and Therapeutic services we aim to help enhance the quality of the lives of our Special Children.

The center delivers its services through two programmes comprising of various activities. The schedule is based on the child's individual education plan. The programs and the respective activities are as under.

#### 1. Life Skills Development

Activities which come easily to most individuals, pose huge challenges for special children which include the following

- a. Performing activities of daily living
- b. Cognitive Skills
- c. Mobility
- d. Body awareness
- e. Communicating and following instructions

- A. To this end, we work with children in the following areas to teach them skills to handle personal needs on their own
  - \* Activities of Daily Living (eating, bathing, toileting, personal care and hygiene)
  - \* Education (Formal education through NIOS)
  - \* Computers
  - \* Interpersonal Skills
  - \* Home Management and Housekeeping
  - \* Tailoring
  - \* Gardening
  - \* Arts and Crafts
  - \* Personal safety & Security
- B. Interpersonal Skills; Interpersonal Skills are crucial for getting around the world. At Subhiksha we look at helping our children to develop their social skills so that they can do the following
- C. Make new friends, Communicate clearly to address their needs, Ask for support/assistance, hold conversation with family and friends
- D. Personal Safety and security: Given the challenges of personal safety and security for every child in today's times the risks are even higher for special children. At Subhiksha we aim to equip our children for them to be able to learn the following crucial aspects of personal and safety
- E. Understand the kind of risks, how to avoid unsafe situations, awareness on personal safety, difference between good and bad touch
- F. Home Management and Housekeeping: Being independent is an extremely crucial skill for everyone. Performing household tasks not only help these children build their abilities to work on their own but also to assist their families. This in turn not only helps in building interpersonal relationships but also helps child gain self worth and respect from their families. Our children are given training in the following areas
  - Cleaning
  - Dusting
  - Setting Table
  - Folding Clothes
  - Money Management (Familiarization with notes, coins and doing transactions in shopping)
  - Setting Cupboard
  - Ironing clothes
- G. Gardening: It is a proven fact that how being close to nature is good for one's well being. When we teach our children gardening we know it will do this, as well as help them develop a hobby and assist with better hand movements.
- H. Art and Craft: The activity of art and craft the children enjoy dearly. This helps them at various levels wherein it gives a creative outlet to them besides helping with motor skills, hand coordination and amazing confidence.
- I. We have a computer lab and special mouses to help our children learn better.
- J. Education: Subhiksha ensures that our children learn basic academics according to their level of learning ability. Children are trained in the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) syllabus which is an accredited board under Ministry of Human Resources Development. Children will ultimately be awarded an NIOS certificate.

Special Education Courses are delivered to children on 3 levels: A, B and C.

The Open Basic Education Programme is offered at three levels "A" B"and" C"

- Level A Level A is equivalent to standard III of the formal education system.
- Level B Level B is equivalent to standard V of the formal education system.
- Level C Level C is equivalent to standard VIII of the formal education system.

With the vision of Sustainable inclusive learning with universal and flexible access to quality school education and skill development, Government of India has established the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS). They launched the Open Basic Education as an alternative educational programme equivalent to the formal education system. Subhiksha Voluntary Organization has been accredited with National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) under the Open Basic Education (OBE) since the year 2015 with Accreditation No. OB4700115. We are an accredited institution to carry out the academic functions of both the age groups.

In order to provide an inclusive platform for education, Subhiksha has designed a program including special adaptations to the content for children with special needs. They aim to provide a holistic accessible platform for children with special needs. After proper assessment and evaluation the students who are found to be educable /academically capable of pursuing education are further trained to pursue further education.

Successful candidates are given a joint certificate from Subhiksha School and NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF OPEN SCHOOLING. As per the capacity and requirement of the child, he/she is allowed to prepare for NIOS Secondary on completion of Level A, B and C. Students are prepared for the Board Exams through Individualised Education Programme and Remedial Sessions.

K. Vocational Training Program: Tailoring and Embriodery Courses training programme is initiated for the underprivileged girls and women at the Centre. The objective of the project is to enhance the employability through vocational training.

Cybage Software Company Pvt Limited through CSR arm of Khusboo Chartiable Trust has supported the skill training of 50 students of Tailoring and Embriodery courses for the period of six months.

#### **OPERATIONS AT A GLANCE**

The offline classes for primary schools and NIOS resumed with parental consent with open basic education from the month of August 2022. All the needy students were supported by the transport facilities picking up from their homes and dropping them back safely. Distribution of stationary items were done and dry ration was done in the last week of August.

Parent teachers meeting is held to discuss the academic and behavioral condition of the parents. They also suggested taking precautions to avoid any contact with the coronavirus. An internal assessment of the students took place to check their academic progress. Parents were not sure whether to send children to the school and were not ready to give their consent for the same. The poor economic condition of many students has an adverse effect on their health. Many parents did not give consent to send their children to physical classes. Some of them joined classes in the first week of October . Therefore revision of the lessons was done as well. When the students came to school, they found they were below the expected academic level and had some behavioral issues as well. With proper guidance and counseling to the parents and with the help of teachers the academic levels have been improved

In total 33 children have written examinations in National Institute of Open Schooling in A B and C level. The examination were conducted from 21<sup>st</sup> March 2022 to 28<sup>th</sup> March 2022. Evaluators came from NIOS Board during the examinations at the centre.

Under events all the occasions like Independence day, Republic Day and festivals like Holi, Diwali and Dasara were celebrated.



Finally the physical classes resumed fully this year, we found that most of our children had fallen behind in their learning. So we came up with fresh development plans and devised the schedule accordingly. This experience gained helped us to move further with new learning curve and adjustments. This annual report tries to summarise all those challenges and experiences. It is not only a momen to recall for Subhiksha ,but also an opportunity to communicate to our supporters and stakeholders who have stood by us through the journey. Thank you!

#### Founders'Voice

The past few months in the post covid situation there was a transition of classes from online to offline mode. Finally when the physical classes resumed fully this year, we assessed that most of the children has fallen back in their learning levels. We restarted with them and there was fresh assessment for every child even though most of them have been with us for few years. In some ways, it has been almost like restarting our centre. But if we look at the brighter side, it has been a kind of blessing in disguise. When a child has been with us for so many years he/she has been in a particular schedule and intervention. Now we are looking at every child afresh and re-drawing the development plan. We have also been able to bring in new interventions.

Efforts were also pointed towards the skill training of the adolescent girls and youth in the vocational courses the process of new admissions in the online portal of Vocational Board has been done.

Also, despite challenges, we have continued our work on the underprivileged Special children and youth. So the year, I would say has been a mixed bag of experiences- some good, some encouraging and little bit challenging also. When I look back, I feel to come out more resilient in dealing with difficult situations. I strongly acknowledge the contribution and support from the donors who stood with us in the crucial situations and the patience of our staff.


